## North Lancing School aims:

- To provide high quality sports teaching and coaching for all pupils.
- To ensure all pupils leave school being able to swim at least 25metres
- To harness the potential of those pupils gifted in sports and physical activity.
- To provide opportunities for pupils to compete through regular matches, tournaments and competitions.
- To encourage all children to find a sport or physical activity they love enough to participate in beyond school.
- To promote healthy, active life styles.

## Nature of support

- Provide regular opportunities for pupils to participate in age appropriate, competitive sport both within and beyond school.
- Ensure sustainable improvement to PE provision by providing training and support for teaching staff through releasing skilled staff to support, team teach and coach.
- Diversifying opportunities on offer for our students to encourage trialling of new sports with the hope of developing a lifelong passion. Alternative activities such as archery, basketball, table tennis, karate, athletics, running, cheerleading, handball and gymnastics are offered.
- Improve ability to teach swimming and the offer of 'top-up' sessions will ensure all pupils leave NLS being competent swimmers.
- Extended opportunities for gifted and talented students with additional cricket coaching, morning clubs and through partnerships with the Sir Robert Woodard Academy.
- Work alongside charities such as the British Heart Foundation and Marathon Kids to provide opportunities for pupils to learn about and adopt more healthy lifestyles.

Students have benefitted from high quality teaching. Staff confidence is high.
Gifted and talented opportunities	(from above)	Provide gifted pupils with regular access	Gifted and talented students participated in additional weekly sessions in a range of sports including athletics, rugby, football, netball,
Swimming teaching	£850	To maintain training of swimming staff to Level 2. Top up swimming sessions for students.	The school swimming teacher/life guard has maintained her qualifications. Every year 6 pupil left school being able to swim 25 metres unaided. All pupils were taught swimming.
Provide opportunities for students to compete	£2,000	Release staff to organise and take students to local and area competitions in a range of sports	Pupils successfully participated in local and county competitions in indoor and outdoor athletics, cricket, stoolball, cross-country running, football, netball, tag rugby. The school won the majority of these competitions.
Promote healthy, active lifestyles	£400	Work with the Heart Foundation and introduction of Marathon Kids.	Marathon Kids established a link with the school. An assembly was run on adopting healthy lifestyles and the children registered for the scheme. It is due to run from November 2017.

Provide diversity of opportunity	£300	Taster sessions and short blocks of teaching in different sports, including a range of after school clubs	Taster sessions and clubs have been run in archery, gymnastics, multi-skills, cricket, table tennis, karate and handball. Over 30 pupils now regularly attend an afterschool cricket club and similar amounts participate weekly in karate.
Netball court markings	£150	Mark out the netball courts for training and matches.	The netball courts have been marked out and subsequently the school hosted 8 matches against other local schools. The team won the indoor tournament, won the Lancing schools Year 6 tournament and were runners up in the Year 5 competition. 36 pupils attended after school netball club.
